

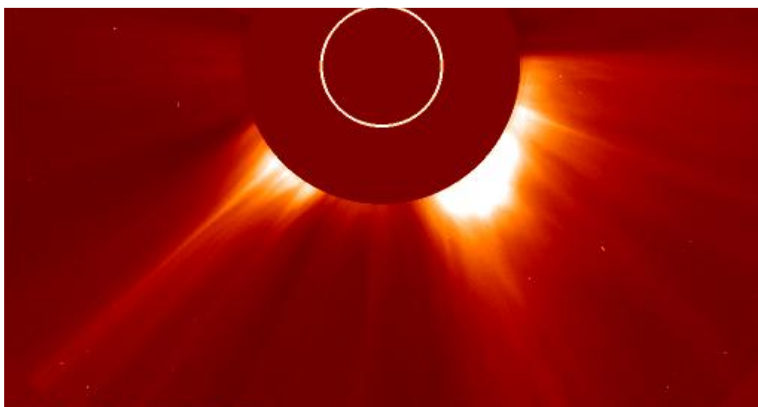
A solar storm spreads out into space.
